

SRUSSIES VIDEONLINE ESTANAI

Article I: Scope of the festival

CENTRALE, the City of Brussels' contemporary art centre, situated at 45 Place Sainte-Catherine in 1000 Brussels, is launching an online festival of emerging artists in collaboration with the art schools of the Belgian capital.

Partners: Académie Royale des Beaux-Arts de Bruxelles (ARBA-ESA), École Nationale Supérieure des Arts Visuels de La Cambre (La Cambre), École de recherche graphique (ERG), Institut national supérieur des arts du spectacle (INSAS), LUCA School of Arts et Royal Institute for Theatre, Cinema and Sound (RITCS). Each school has selected three videos made by recently graduated alumni for the festival.

This festival is broadcast via Vimeo and is relayed through various digital media such as CENTRALE's website, and its Instagram and Facebook accounts.

The Brussels Videonline Festival will span over 6 days, from **19 to 25 February 2024**: on each day at 6 pm, three videos selected by a school will be uploaded online for a duration of 23 hours, i.e., until 5 pm the following day. A total of 18 videos will be made freely available for viewing.

Article II: Conditions of the Brussels Videonline Festival

1. Online posting of works

Between 19 and 25 February 2024, three videos per school will be available every evening on CENTRALE's Vimeo account (https://vimeo.com/centralebrussels) between 6pm and 5pm the following day. In total, the festival proposes 18 videos (three videos per school), during 6 evenings and nights, each dedicated to one school. The videos will last a total of 20 minutes maximum.

2. Festival communication

The festival's communication is done through the newsletter of CENTRALE, a Facebook event, and Instagram, which is fed daily.

Each day, a school is in the spotlight, along with the programme of the three selected videos and Vimeo link. This information will also be relayed on CENTRALE's website and on its Instagram account.

Article III: Purpose of the Audience Award and CENTRALE Awards

1. Audience Award

Vote: The aim of this festival is to showcase the work of emerging artists amongst the general public, who are invited to vote via a Google Form. Every day, Internet users can vote for their favourite video(s) using exclusively CENTRALE's Google Forms.

Voting procedures: Each voting viewer is only allowed one vote per daily broadcast period. Each daily voting form will thus be available between 6 p.m. and 5 p.m. the next day, i.e. during the actual screening slot of the videos concerned. Any incomplete, inaccurate or non-compliant participation with these rules will be disregarded and will result in the cancellation of the vote.

Award: At the end of the festival, the **Audience Award** will be awarded to the work that has received the most public votes. Once all the votes have been cast, the winner of the **Audience Award** will receive a prize of 250 euros (including tax) and a public screening of the work at CENTRALE.

2. CENTRALE Award

Award: The CENTRALE Award is awarded by a jury drawn from CENTRALE's team.

Voting procedures: Each member of the jury will examine the videos individually. The video that receives the most votes will be proclaimed the winner. The decisions of the jury cannot be appealed against nor must they be motivated.

The jury is composed by team members of CENTRALE: Patricia Balletti, Antonin Cauwe, Fien Descheemaeker, Olivier Ernould, Badïa Larouci, Tania Nasielski, Nicolas Pompa, Laura Pleuger, Pascale Salesse & Estielle Vandeweeghe

The runner-up, the CENTRALE Award will then receive the same amount i. e. a prize of 250 euros (including tax) and a public screening of the work at CENTRALE.

3. Centre Wallonie Bruxelles Award

New for this year's event is a partnership with Centre Wallonie Bruxelles in Paris, which will be awarding a prize which consists of exhibiting the video work of a young artist as part of 25 Arts Seconde, a showing of artists' films, to be held In Situ in 2025. The prize is also accompanied by a public screening at CENTRALE.

4. Awards' announcement

The winners will be announced at the end of the festival, on 26 February at 6 p.m. via social networks and on CENTRALE's website.

Article IV: Liability

CENTRALE will take all the measures necessary to ensure that the present regulations are respected. However, it cannot be held responsible in the event that the present festival and its voting should be modified, postponed or cancelled, even without prior notice, for any particular reason whatsoever. CENTRALE reserves the right to suspend the festival and its voting, and to postpone the duration of the festival at any time and without prior notice.

CENTRALE will not be responsible for any damage incurred by the participant or anyone else, either private individual or legal entity, as a result of their participation in this festival and the awarding of the prizes.

Article V: Fraud

If necessary, CENTRALE reserves the right to invalidate and/or cancel all or part of an entry if any form of fraud of any type or dysfunction appears to have taken place in any form whatsoever, and particularly by computer or manual means within the framework of the entry.

Article VI: Access to the rules

The present rules are published on CENTRALE's website and relayed in the publications concerning this festival and its voting, on the various social networks. The rules will be sent to any person requesting a copy at info@centrale.brussels. CENTRALE reserves the right to modify all or part of the regulations, subject to publication of the new terms and conditions.

Article VII: Legal liability

CENTRALE is not a legal entity; it is managed by Brussels-Musées-Expositions not-for-profit association in collaboration with the Cultural Department of the City of Brussels.
